

100 Sustainable Scottish Buildings

As part of the year of Architecture and Design SEDA is publishing 100 Sustainable Scottish Buildings, a glossy hardback visual and written resource that demonstrates the diversity found in sustainable projects in Scotland. Punctuated by a series of essays on the subject of sustainability.

The aim is to communicate that sustainability does not translate into a particular aesthetic or a particular design approach. 100 Sustainable Scottish Buildings is not a list of the top one hundred, rather it will highlight the benefits and evolving practice of sustainable design through evidence and comparison.

Nominations are invited for buildings and projects of any size, type and age. A nomination can be made by anyone, for a project with which they have been intimately involved or one they have just admired from afar.

Submission Guidance Notes

Deadline | 6th March 2016

Submissions should include representative photographs, drawings and a 200-400 word summary. These will be used by the editorial panel to assess the project and if chosen for inclusion, for the basis of the published information. Each project will be published over a minimum of two pages.

The criteria for sustainability will be based on the process, approach and mindset of the project team. The text should provide an outline of what the project is, the original brief or historic purpose, as well as those aspects which sets it above the norm and exemplifies environmental, social and/or environmental sustainability.

The following information must be provided:

- Name, address, telephone number and email address of nominee
- Name and location of the project, including a postcode
- Type of project
- Exact or approximate size in an appropriate unit of measurement
- Exact or approximate date of construction / refurbishment etc

In addition, it would be helpful if you could include:

- The name of the client, architect and main contractor (if known)
- Any facts and figures which you think are important in demonstrating their performance

For publication we will require:

- 200-400 word summary of the submitted project.
- 2+ high quality exterior images of the project
- 1+ interior image
- A detail, sketch or architectural drawing
- All images must have a minimum Resolution of 300 dpi and full Copyright.
- A completed Copyright Disclaimer form (included with this email).

Submitted text and images may be edited before publication in order to ensure a consistent approach to language and page layout. Example layouts are provided on the following pages for your guidance.

Editorial Process

Each submission will be assessed on its own merits and the final 100 projects will include historic and contemporary buildings, refurbishments and new buildings, large and small buildings from domestic, education, workplace and leisure sectors; as well as potentially other design interventions such as infrastructure, landscapes etc. Inevitably this will mean that some will be disappointed that their submission is not included in order to preserve the overall balance of the book. All profits from the sale of 100 Sustainable Scottish Buildings will go to support the work of the Scottish Ecological Design Association.

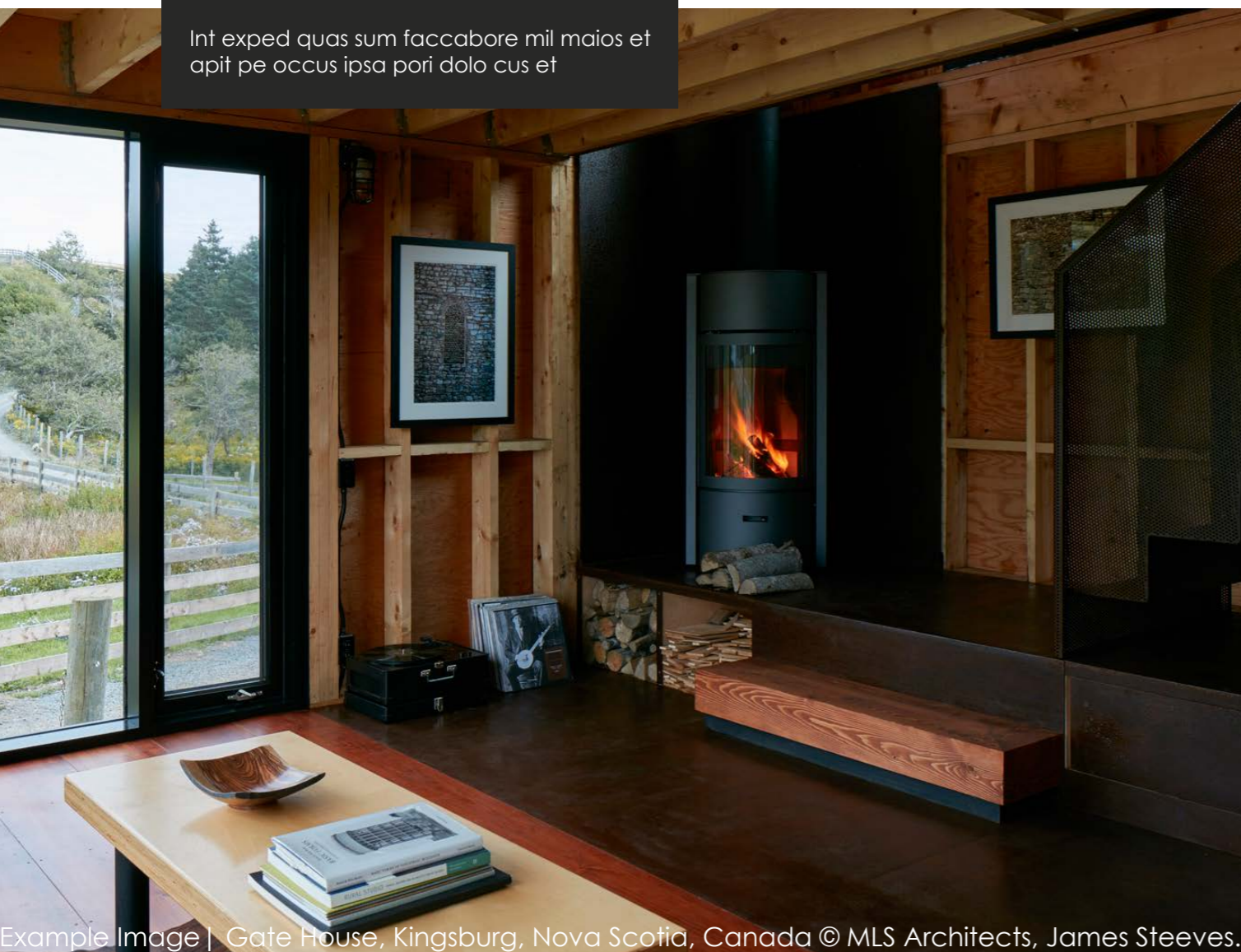
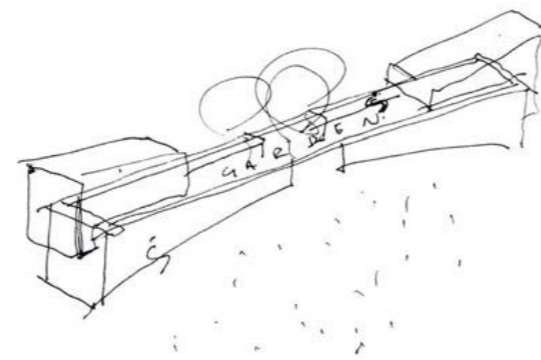

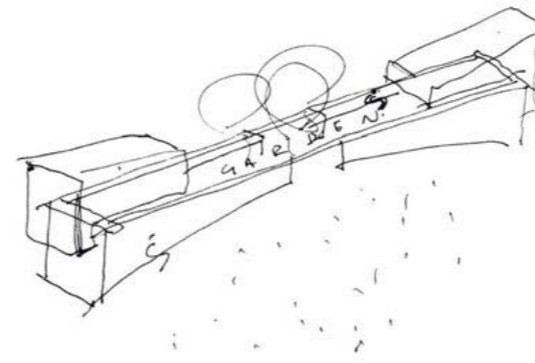
